Our children aren't the only ones learning in school. Our adults are always learning too. Here's just a glimpse at the training we have had in school over the last few weeks...

The senior leadership team have started our journey this week to becoming a Talk4 Writing school. The rest of the staff will be trained before the start of the new school year and so we can start teaching writing using this approach across the whole school from September

Mrs Islam is currently completing a phonics project in which she has visited a number of schools using the same scheme for phonics as us.

Mrs Murt is currently developing our **maths** curriculum working on a number of projects and visiting other schools to see best practice in mastery.

Miss McNeill is set to take over leading PHSE when Miss Higginson starts her maternity leave. They both attended the PHSE conference last week to get ideas to further develop our curriculum

Miss McArdle is part of a project called "Transforming your school's **reading** culture" looking at how we teach reading and instil a love of reading in our children. This is a priority for school going forward.

Mrs Cottom and I are now enrolled at Chester University to complete masters credit course on **trauma** informed approaches. This will involve us undertaking research in school and developing our environment to support the wellbeing and mental health of our children.

..this is only a snap-shot! If you are wondering what else our adults are currently working on, just ask!


#### Lights, camera...action!
